BALANCED CURRICULUM

We pride ourselves on a college preparatory curriculum that provides a well-rounded education. Coursework at Southwestern is based on University of California entrance requirements.

<i>Subject Areas</i>	<i>Credits Required for a College Recommending Diploma</i>
History & Social Studies	30 credits with 10 credits required in U.S. History, 10 in World Cultures/ Geography, 5 in U.S. Government, 5 in Economics.
English	40 credits , including at least a year of literature. Our students must take an English class each semester, even if 40 credits in English have been earned already. All English classes will include frequent writing and the reading of literature.
Mathematics	30 credits required, 40 preferred, including elementary and advanced algebra, geometry, and advanced math.
Laboratory Sciences	30 credits , 40 suggested, in lab science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of these areas: biology, chemistry, organic chemistry, and physics. Earth/space science courses are acceptable if they require or include basic knowledge in biology, chemistry, or physics.
A Language Other Than English	20 credits of the same language; 30 credits preferred.
Visual & Performing Arts	10 credits in music, visual art, drama/theater.
Electives	50 credits minimum, of which at least 10 must be college preparatory courses.
Physical Education	40 credits (sports, varsity teams, and/or physical exercise).
Community Service	100 hours minimum completed during high school years.

COLLEGE PREPARATION

One of our most important goals is to prepare you for college—not simply to be accepted, but also to succeed there. Our students develop solid study habits, time management skills, and self-reliance. Finally, you'll receive appropriate college counseling to help you find the right one for your needs and interests. Once you've decided on your top schools, we'll guide you through the application process. If you need more time to develop your skills, a postgraduate year of study is available.

SAN MARINO CAMPUS

On the San Marino Campus, near Pasadena in Southern California, students enjoy a safe, peaceful environment with all the exciting learning and entertainment opportunities of a vibrant big city nearby. Junior high and high school students come to San Marino for our college preparatory academic program, while international students learn English in our ESL Program before moving into mainstream classes.

An Ideal Location for Learning

Southwestern Academy's original campus is located on eight acres in the city of San Marino with its gracious homes. The Los Angeles metropolitan area is a learning laboratory for our students, offering a range of museums, theaters, concerts, and more as a field trip destination. Our location also offers warm and usually sunny weather to aid in making the learning environment pleasurable.

San Marino Facilities

Southwestern Academy opened in a former governor's mansion in a vast orange grove just over 95 years ago. Today, eight red-roofed buildings circle the sports field, where you might play a soccer match against another school. Or you may find yourself playing a jazz concert in Lincoln Hall, which also contains nine classrooms, a science lab, library, and computer center.

The renovated Washington Gym houses the volleyball/ basketball court and a weight room and an upstairs seating area. Just near the gym, students bring life to musical instruments, 3-D printing designs, digital cameras, acrylic paints, and grand pianos in the music and arts complex. Vegetable and flower gardens, a chapel, tennis courts, and an outdoor amphitheater rounds out our campus.

Dormitories and Dining

Your dorm room is home for up to four students. There are four boys' dorms on campus, and the girls' dorms are a mile south of the main campus. A laundry room and television lounge is near each dorm, while dorm parents live in adjoining apartments. Meals are served family style, with students and teachers dining together during hot and hearty, buffet-style breakfasts, lunches, and dinners. On warm days, barbecue lunches come out from the grill.

BEAVER CREEK RANCH CAMPUS

In Northern Arizona, Southwestern Academy provides a learning experience that incorporates the beautiful natural environment into a high school curriculum. Limited to 50 boarding students to maximize personal attention, this campus offers college preparatory academic classes for grades 9-12 and English as a Second Language Program.

A Beautiful Location

The city of Sedona is an international tourist destination that attracts more than four million visitors per year. The area is known around the world for its art galleries and spectacular scenery. Many films and commercials are shot on location here in Sedona, which has been a hotspot for Hollywood celebrities. Southwestern Academy's Beaver Creek Ranch is 12 miles from this unique city, surrounded by National Forest lands. The campus offers a safe environment and moderate weather, between desert and mountain.

Beaver Creek Ranch

Set in a deep red rock canyon, you'll find a school like no other, where nature provides the ultimate learning laboratory for our full college prep curriculum. History, Geology, Archaeology, and Art lessons are experienced everywhere on campus.

Set on 180 acres, the private ranch was originally built as a fashionable hunting lodge. Soak in the rustic charm of the Rimrock Room, with its rough—hewn timber ceilings and adobe fireplace, decorated with Native American pottery. The main study hall is modeled after a "Hogan", or a circular family home of the Dine or Navajo American Indian people.

Facilities

The Beaver Creek Ranch Campus offers dorm rooms that accommodate one to four people. Meals are served in the dining room and sometimes in the charming courtyard where picnics are also popular.

A lounge with a huge fireplace is a favorite spot for students to watch movies. Seven stone cottages are home to faculty and staff, set along trout-filled Beaver Creek. Two fishing ponds, pastures, prehistoric Indian caves, and a favorite swimming hole in the creek can be found on campus. Even in this remote, rugged environment you can contact friends and family.

The creek that runs through campus is stocked with trout for fishing.



Meals enjoyed by students, faculty and staff usually include ingredients from the campus' organic garden.

Activities

You can learn to ride and care for horses or swing on a rope over the creek and drop in for a swim. Our indoor pool is heated if you like warmer water. The campus offers a full program of sports, including golf, and a full range of art classes. Wildlife including mule deer, bighorn sheep, and javelin, can be seen on hikes. Other recreation opportunities including camping, hiking, mountain biking, fishing, and backpacking.

Southwestern offers choral and instrumental music instruction, where you'll regularly perform in concerts, choir, or band. YOU BELONG ON A TEAM AND IN THE OUTDOORS

Southwestern students are a community in the classroom, on the sports field, and in the outdoors. It's all about teamwork, whether you are passing the soccer ball or passing a water bottle on a long hike.

Sports Teams

Everyone has the chance to be a superstar on a Southwestern sports team, no matter what your previous experience. You'll have the opportunity to compete, even if your goal is only to have a good time. At Southwestern, everyone plays.

We play boys' and girls' varsity and junior varsity sports against other schools in our leagues—our teams are called the Southwestern Sun. In fact, we have won many championships in soccer, cross country, baseball, volleyball, basketball, and track. We compete in the California Interscholastic Federation and the Northern Arizona Sports Conference.

Sports Facilities

Sports facilities on the San Marino Campus include a newly renovated gym, soccer field, baseball diamond with dugout and batting cage, indoor and outdoor volleyball, basketball and tennis courts. The Beaver Creek Ranch Campus also has an active sports program and facilities include a soccer field and a gym with basketball and volleyball courts. Other opportunities are available in golf, swimming, tennis, weight training, and horseback riding.

Outdoor Experiences

With the Beaver Creek Ranch Campus set in a wilderness area, every day offers an opportunity to enjoy the beauty of nature. You can also participate in outdoor skills workshops including camping, hiking, astronomy, land navigation, and first aid skills. Day hikes are popular, with trips to prehistoric caves above the red rock cliffs. Mountain bikes and fishing poles are available, and camping trips are offered on many weekends.

You will find plenty of outdoor opportunities on the San Marino Campus as well. The Environmental Club regularly plans visits, hikes, and camping trips to locations such as the beach, Mount Baldy, Anza Borrego, the Channel Islands, and more.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE, POSTGRADUATE, AND SUMMER PROGRAMS

In addition to our standard academic curriculum, three special programs are offered at Southwestern: our English as a Second Language program, a Postgraduate year, and Summer Adventures program. They are offered on both Southwestern campuses.

ESL Program

In our close-knit environment, international students are part of our community. For more than 60 years, students from countries in Europe, Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Mexico, and Central and South America have come to Southwestern to learn English and prepare to attend an American university. International students live on campus, and quickly make friends with all.

Once you arrive at Southwestern, we test your English skills so we can place you in the appropriate class: beginning, intermediate, or advanced. In your class, you will practice listening, speaking, grammar, phonics, reading, writing, vocabulary, conversation, and note taking. While you're learning English, you will also be taking classes in topics such as mathematics, art, and music. In the higher levels, you can take classes to help you transition to mainstream literature, writing, science, and history. Once proficient in English, you will move into our mainstream high school classes.

Postgraduate Year

After graduation, some students find they need more time to be ready for college-level work. They may need to improve their English language skills or take higher level classes during an extra year of preparation. They emphasize independent study, directed reading, critical thinking, and writing.

Summer Programs

Summer is an exciting time at Southwestern Academy. Our Summer Adventures program combines classroom education with fun activities. You can enjoy summer while earning school credits toward graduation. Intensive courses in ESL as well as SAT and TOEFL preparation are also available.

Held on the San Marino and the Beaver Creek Ranch Campus, Summer Adventures is offered for grades 7th through 12th. Our small classes and enthusiastic faculty will help you accelerate your studies. There are many opportunities for good times, including afternoon sports and weekly field trips. You will end the summer with improved academic skills, new friends from around the world, and plenty of great memories.

The San Marino campus is located in one of the most beautiful residential neighborhoods in Southern California, minutes away from Pasadena and Los Angeles. The Beaver Creek Ranch campus is located in the red rock canyon country of the Coconino National Forest, 12 miles from beautiful Sedona, Arizona. The 185 acre campus is at a 3,500-foot elevation which allows for lower summer temperatures, making the Beaver Creek Ranch Campus an ideal place for enhancing academic skills, making new friends, and exploring the beautiful outdoors.

ESL classes are designed to enhance reading, writing, and conversational English, coupled with mathematics. Students gain academic confidence, master challenging material, and improve their study habits while enjoying exciting outdoor activities such as horseback riding, camping, swimming, fishing, hiking and mountain biking in Arizona’s Red Rock Country.

Each student has the opportunity to visit the Grand Canyon, Montezuma Castle National Monument, the Arizona Science Center, Lowell Observatory and many other fascinating places during weekly educational fieldtrips. Come join us for a fun summer of learning and exploring in the unique beauty of the American southwest.
