The Big Picture Seminar in Québec City helps students entering Grade 9 to acquire a broad vision of the importance of their education. The program touches on subjects such as studies, extracurricular activities, career and university planning, character formation, and leadership. This is combined with sports, white water rafting, and other recreational activities.

Participants of this activity will travel to Québec City to help at L'Arche community. L'Arche was founded by Jean Vanier and is dedicated to helping people with intellectual developmental disabilities. Participants will care for the people living at L'Arche and assist in various tasks as needed in the community.

The young men who attend help with infrastructure projects in villages — such as building septic tanks, community halls and chapels. They also interact with the local youth and community.
