Why Hudson?

For more than 15 years, Hudson has been dedicated to developing the **whole child**—intellectually, emotionally, socially—so that they become a **caring, responsible, and productive member** of the global community.

Our Lower School offers a **balanced-yet-rigorous** learning environment where, early on, students develop **critical thinking skills**, engage in **creative thought**, and acquire **good, lasting habits** for ideal learning—setting the stage for their success throughout their school years and beyond.

Hudson's consistent curricular approach combines the strength of a **stimulating foundational academic program** in math, science, language, the arts, and health/fitness with **positive learning experiences**, including character education and community service. In addition, students' individual skills are **thoughtfully nurtured** while they **learn collaboratively**, which effectively helps them understand concepts more profoundly.



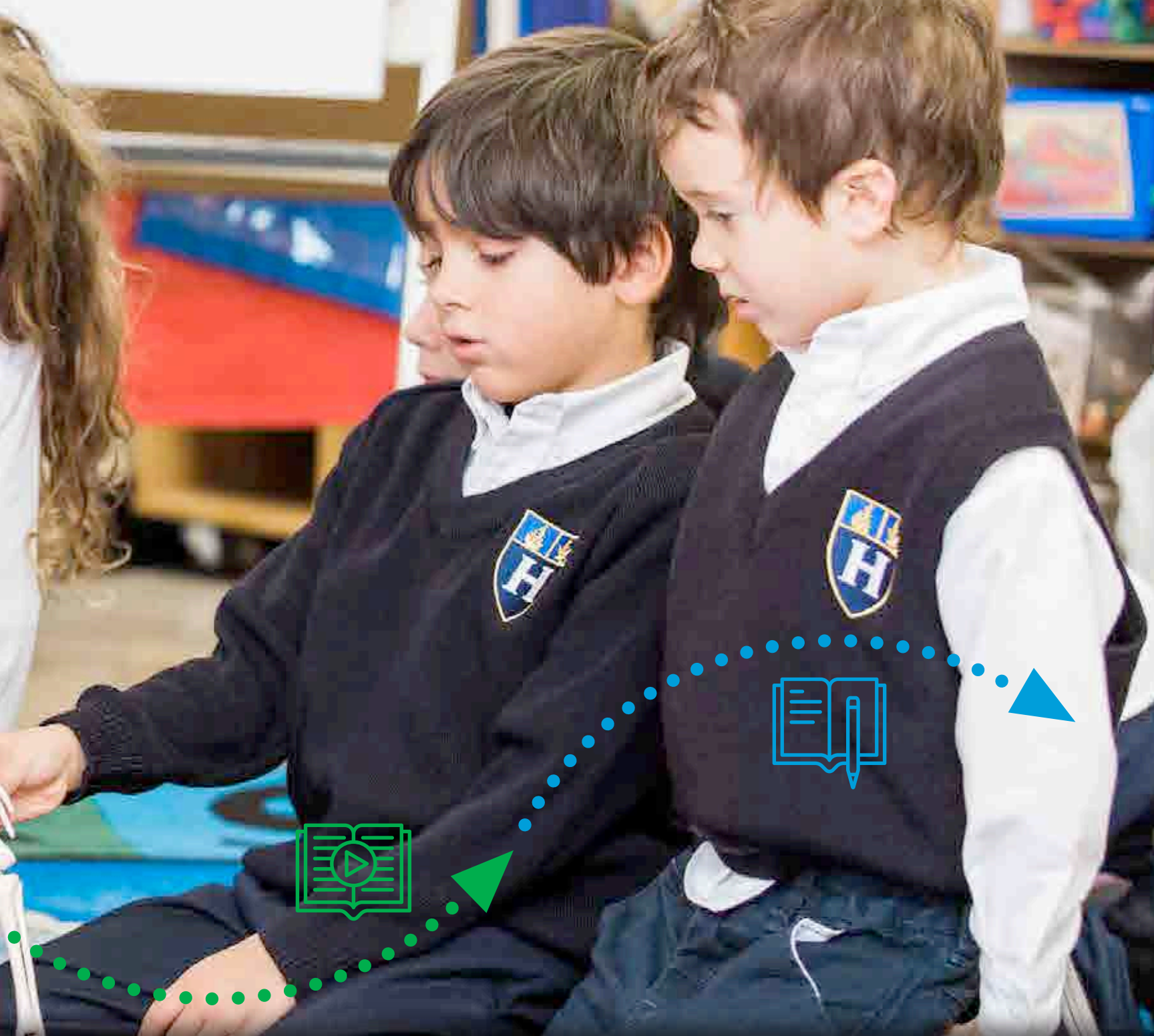




Reggio Emilia Approach

Hudson Lower School employs a **Reggio Emilia-inspired teaching pedagogy** which encourages children to **explore, investigate, and grow**. Originally instituted in Northern Italy, the Reggio Emilia method is founded on the belief that children's curiosity about their world—as well as their innate sense of **creativity**—should **guide their learning**.

Students are given long-term collaborative projects that purposefully connect core academic areas of language, mathematics, science, and the arts. This creates an **experiential, collaborative learning environment** across all Lower School grade levels.



Lower School students learn to think **rationally** and **independently**, to **understand the connection between ideas** in order to see them from **different perspectives**.

Teachers present units of study in language, media, science, and social studies that incorporate critical thinking, often beginning with **challenging questions** that ignite an interest in a topic being studied.

Novel studies begin in Grade 3 for the purpose of engaging and teaching students **how to relate stories to broader, historical and social contexts**. As students progress through their study, teachers encourage students to **reflect upon their own understandings** and ideas critically, so that they may **make connections** and relate them to class discussions. Such reflective processes help to develop **the whole child** and **create more active learners** capable of independent thought.





Saxon Math

Hudson teaches **Saxon mathematics**, a highly regarded, rigorous program that spirals the instruction of each concept and continues to review information introduced earlier. This allows students the time to **practice** and **retain math concepts** to the level of mastery.



Critical Thinking

In the global knowledge economy that increasingly demands us to analyze information and integrate different sources of data to problem-solve, it is vital for young students to **learn critical thinking skills**. Students who can think critically do better academically, as well as in life.



Caring Teachers

Hudson's teachers go above and beyond. They're mentors, coaches, and leaders—some of the best in their fields of study. Students receive individual attention that is truly beneficial and constructive, with the **average student-to-teacher ratio being 12:1**.



True Diversity

Hudson is an **inclusive, safe, vibrant, and welcoming** place. We recognize that a **diverse, multicultural learning experience** broadens students' intellectual and social horizons and promotes appreciation, tolerance, and an understanding of other cultures. Hudson's diverse environment encourages all students to be themselves, which fosters mutual respect of the uniqueness of others.



Clubs & Activities

Hudson offers a **wide range of clubs** and activities, with **three seasons of sports** and opportunities, including seasonal **co-curriculars** such as skating and swimming.* Students compete against other private schools in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) within the Small Schools Athletic Federation (SSAF), which has approximately 70-member schools. *Learn more about co-curriculars on page 18.

We see our **youngest learners** as **intellectually powerful, naturally inquisitive**, and **innately creative**, so our Junior- and Senior-level Kindergarten classes keep pace with their energy and curiosity. We promote **experiential learning** as well as establishing a **solid foundation** for students' future academic success.

Hudson values the enthusiasm of our youngest students and **every child** is encouraged to **share their thoughts and ideas** while engaging in **collaborative activities and problem-solving**.



Collaboration



Reggio teaching practices are most successful when there is a **collaborative learning partnership** between parents, teachers, and students. Therefore, you, **our Hudson parents, are our partners** in your child's education. Feedback from parents and teachers is crucial to supporting a student's current learning path and future growth.

Environment



A Reggio-inspired school sees the **space in which children learn as a third teacher**, which is why Hudson's classrooms are designed for collaborative, inquiry-based learning. Our classrooms provide access to materials that promote hands-on learning and the application of essential academic skills and knowledge.

Teachers as Guides



Our Kindergarten teachers are **co-constructors of knowledge, researchers, documentarians, and advocates**. They provide resources for children to engage in inquiry, with appropriate guidance to ensure that learning experiences support mastery of the curriculum.

Projects



Projects are central to both the children's and teacher's learning experience. **Hands-on projects** inspire **creativity, critical thinking skills, and discussion**. Project ideas are determined by the children's interests and tied to Ontario curricular guidelines.





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PRIMARY & JUNIOR YEARS

Grade 1 – Grade 5

being confident

Solid **grounding** for **foundational** years

The elementary years are a critical time for a **child's personal** and **academic development**, as their receptivity and capacity to learn are at their peak. It's during these years that students acquire coping and socialization skills, so a comprehensive introduction to formalized education is paramount.

Hudson's Primary & Junior Program is founded on the idea that every student possesses the capacity to succeed. We foster students' **self-confidence**, help them acquire **critical thinking** skills, and continue to nurture their **love of learning**. Our program establishes a **solid foundation** for future academic achievement by offering **rigorous-yet-balanced** coursework in **mathematics, literacy, life and physical sciences, French, technology and media studies, visual art, drama, and music**. Students' skills are also **continuously assessed** to ensure they are equipped with the core knowledge needed for Middle School years and beyond.





The Primary years also greatly depend upon **experiential learning**, so Hudson students get hands-on opportunities to **learn beyond the classroom**. We **partner** with significant **cultural venues** and recreational centers to offer off-campus field work, and **technology** plays a more prominent role in learning.

In addition, **co-curricular activities** are introduced into students' schedules to help them identify interests and develop their **social** and **leadership skills**. Examples include:

- University of Waterloo Math competitions
- the integration of STEM subjects
- a competitive Science Fair
- Writing Club
- hands-on lab work (including science experiments)



Parents as Partners

Primary & Junior School years at Hudson are viewed as an extension of family, and for this reason, we encourage an **active partnership with parents**. We're committed to open communication: we work with you, our parents, to collaboratively problem-solve and make decisions.

Experiential Learning: Grades 4–6 Outdoor Adventure Trip

Around the end of October each year, students and teachers attend an **outdoor education camp** in the gorgeous **Muskoka area** of central Ontario. Outdoor activities such as **hiking, canoeing, swimming, cooking, arts**, and **outdoor adventure-based activities** are offered. **Team-building** exercises, games, movies, campfires, and many other exciting activities are planned. Students sleep in cozy cabins and eat delicious, well-prepared meals by experienced chefs!

MIDDLE YEARS

Grade 6 – Grade 8

being independent

Preparing for the next big steps

The **Middle School years** are a time when students **hone essential academic habits**, continue to **grow confidence** and become **resilient**, and **develop positive relationships** across the Hudson community and beyond.

Students build on the skills they've learned in their Primary & Junior School years and **prepare for their transition to Upper School** by engaging in **challenging academic** and **co-curricular activities** that enable them to become **more independent**.

Hudson's **Middle School Program** encourages students to achieve academic excellence and reach their full potential. Smaller class sizes lend themselves to more concentrated, differentiated instruction, so that **teachers can truly engage** and **meet the individual, educational needs of each student**.

In Middle School, **Learner Profiles** are developed and leveraged by Hudson teachers to determine **where students are in their learning**, **what interests their group of students**, and how their students best demonstrate **new skills and knowledge**.

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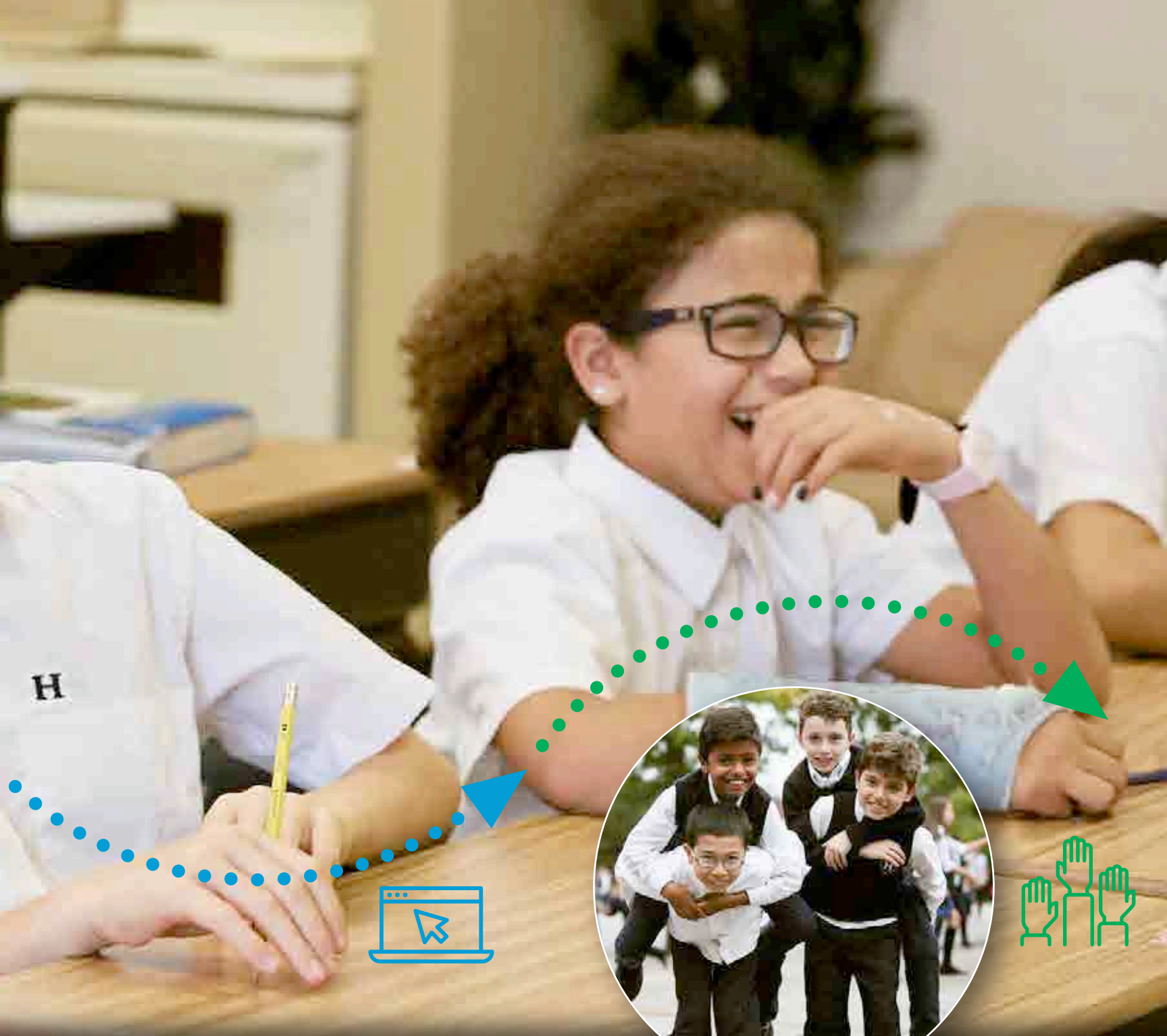
As students enter the next phase of their education in Hudson’s Middle School, we emphasize **academic advancement** in English, mathematics, the sciences, the arts (including music and drama), health/fitness, as well as critical thinking and skills across the core curricula. While students’ academic and social-emotional skills are focused upon in Lower School, in Middle School, they’re further refined with **intentional mentorship and guidance from teachers** in:

Academic Strategies

- Effective note-taking
- Proper citation use
- Test-taking strategies

Executive Functioning Skills

- Planning and organizing work
- Developing better focus and emotional self-regulation
- Revising approaches to achieve results



Effective Communication

- Using technology
- Practicing advocacy through peer mediation
- Writing and presenting skills, essays, research, lab reports, and speeches

Community Service

- Grade 6 students assist lower grades at recess and lunch as part of our **Helping Hands Program**
- Grade 7 students train in **peer mediation to prevent and resolve conflicts** between younger students on the playground or in the hallways
- Grade 8 students design and implement their own **service program**, with a monthly commitment to volunteering at Hudson and in the greater community



Homework & Testing

Middle School students are continuously tested in an informal manner by our teachers, while regular, formative testing ensures that they're reaching and surpassing all academic requirements in each of their respective grades. Students receive a reasonable amount of daily homework, with at least ten minutes of assigned homework daily for each grade level (e.g. A Grade 3 student receives approximately 30 minutes of homework daily, a Grade 6 student receives approximately 60 minutes of homework each day).

French

Hudson also serves as an **Extended French School**, offering core French. Students learn to speak, read, and write in dynamic classes that follow the **Action in Motion (AIM)** program, which culls important vocabulary and grammar to be learned in each unit and incorporates them into a play.



High-Achieving Student Program

Hudson recognizes **high-achieving, academically gifted students**, so these students are offered the opportunity to **enhance their academic strengths** through a **deeper exploration of subjects of interest**, a faster pace in the presentation of material, and a concentrated focus on higher level skills in literacy, mathematics, and science. The goal is to help students realize their full intellectual potential while still benefitting from all other academic, co- and extra-curricular programs.

Experiential Learning

Each year, Hudson offers extended trips to give students the **opportunity to grow** through gradually increased challenges away from home and school.

Grade 7 & 8 Leadership Trip (September)

Students and teachers attend an outdoor adventure camp north of the city to introduce students to **basic survival, team-building, and leadership skills**. We encourage effective and cooperative teamwork through trust exercises and team-based challenges. The trip also prepares students for future, Upper School excursions (Outdoor Education and Leadership).

Grade 7 & 8 Quebec or Ottawa Trips (End of May)

Students and teachers attend a **personalized, all-inclusive trip** to either Quebec City/ Montreal or Ottawa to immerse students in the charm, character, and culture of historic areas of our country. The trips also provide ample curricular tie-ins to their studies of New France, The Seven Years War, Aboriginal Culture, Confederation, and the formation of Canada.





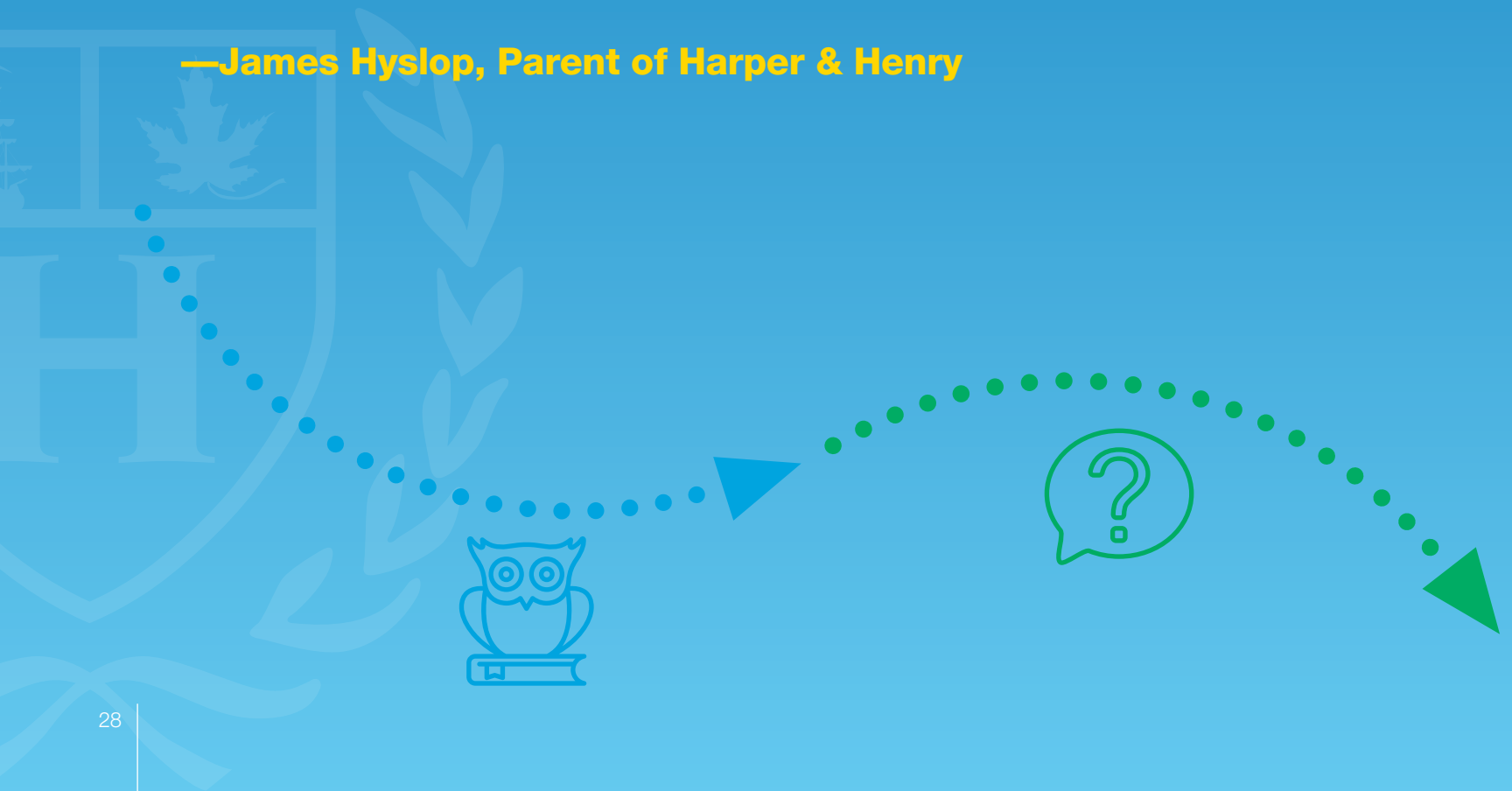

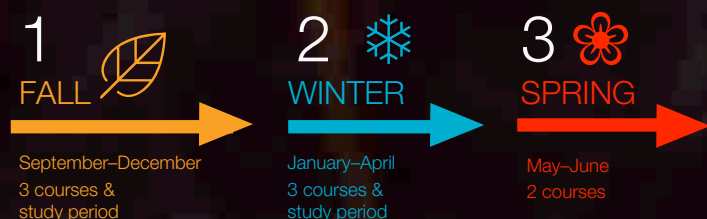
Flexible, Three-Semester System

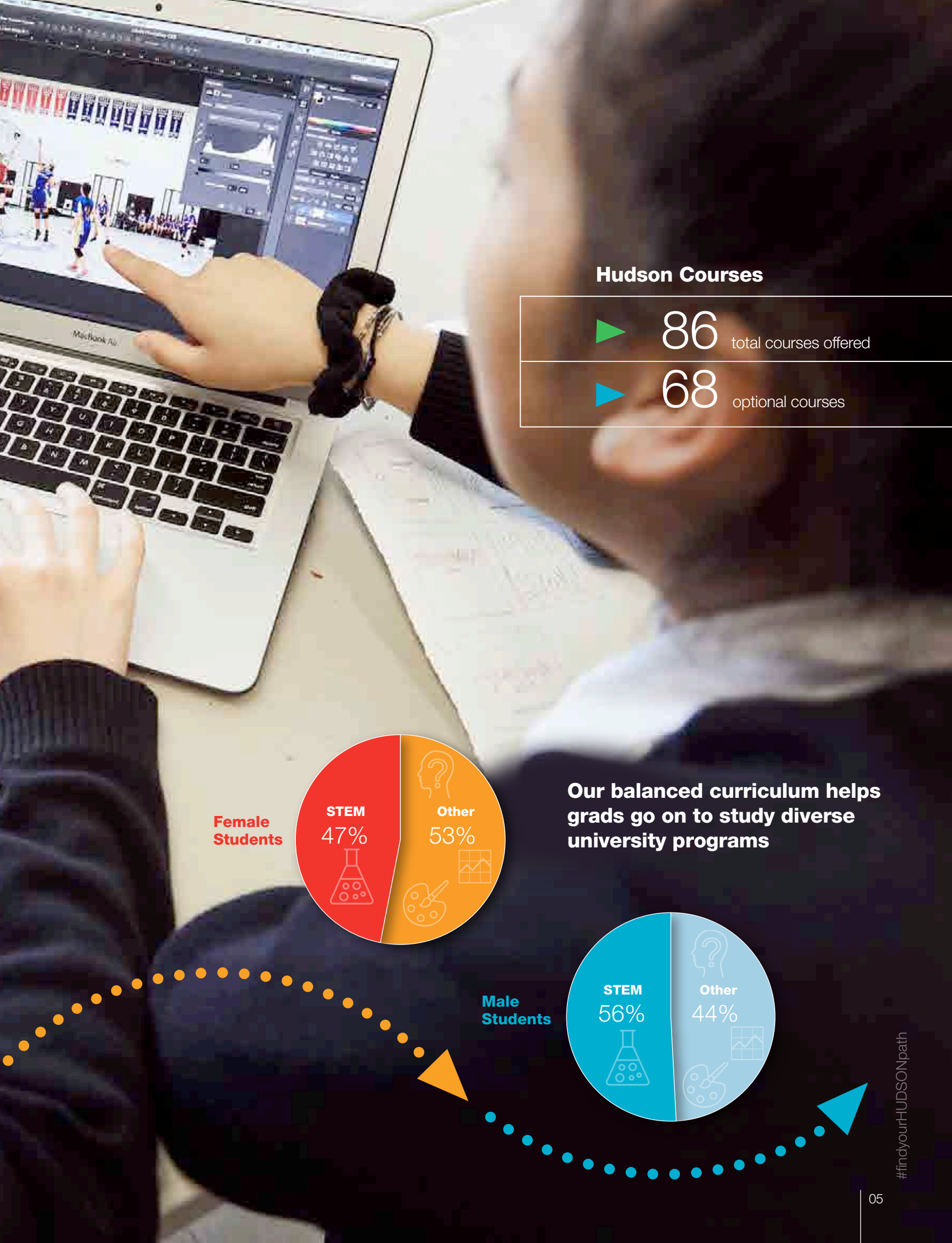

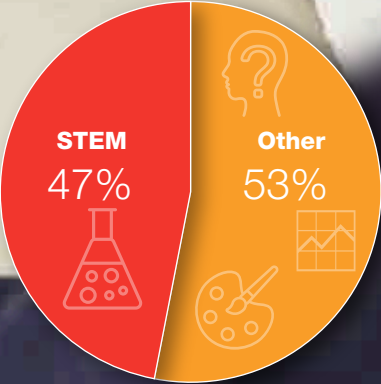

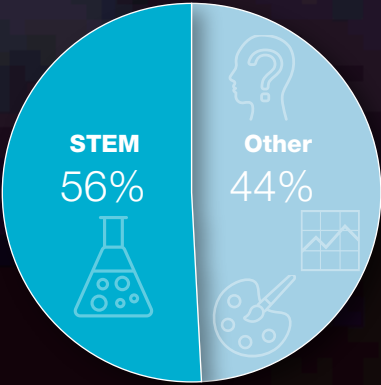

Whether you want to be an astrophysicist, actor, or app developer, you'll have to acquire in-demand skills. Most importantly, you'll need **key skills** to navigate, well, **life!**



Hudson's **skills-based academic program** was carefully designed for you to learn many types of vital skills, across all subject areas. Throughout your four years here, you'll not only learn important academic skills such as how to conduct qualitative and quantitative research, but crucial life skills such as how to resolve conflicts fairly, give a presentation, be an effective listener, manage your time, and be a responsible leader (for more on leadership skills, check out our **Be a leader** section!).

All students also receive a **laptop in Grade 9** to efficiently manage time and assignments, take notes, and have all the required software needed to do schoolwork. You'll also have access to **MyBlueprint**, an online portal to help you select courses, set goals, financially plan, write résumés and cover letters, and build a strong portfolio of your work. We'll even pair you with a **Hudson Helper** so you can successfully transition into Upper School.

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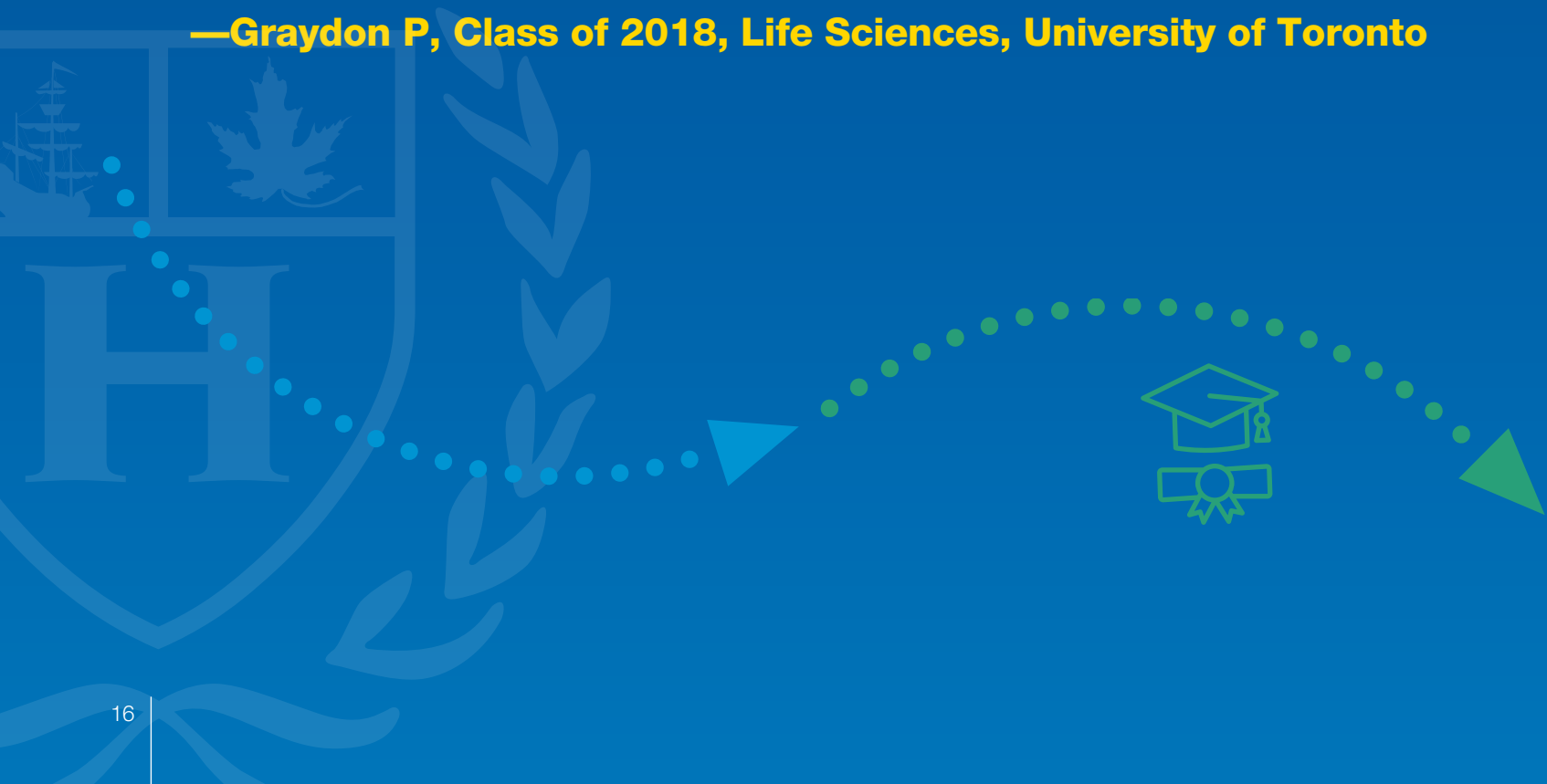

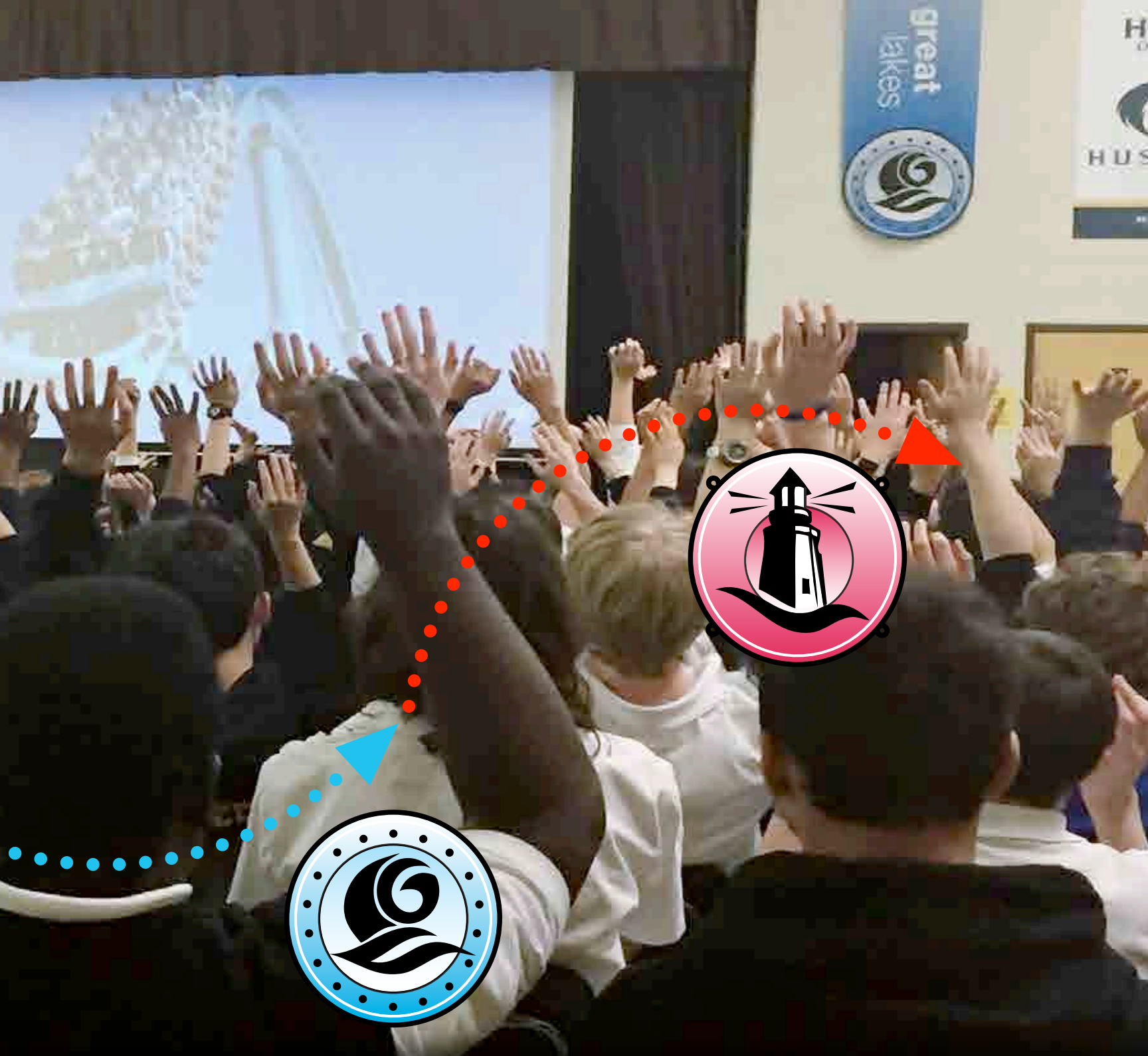
From learners **to leaders**

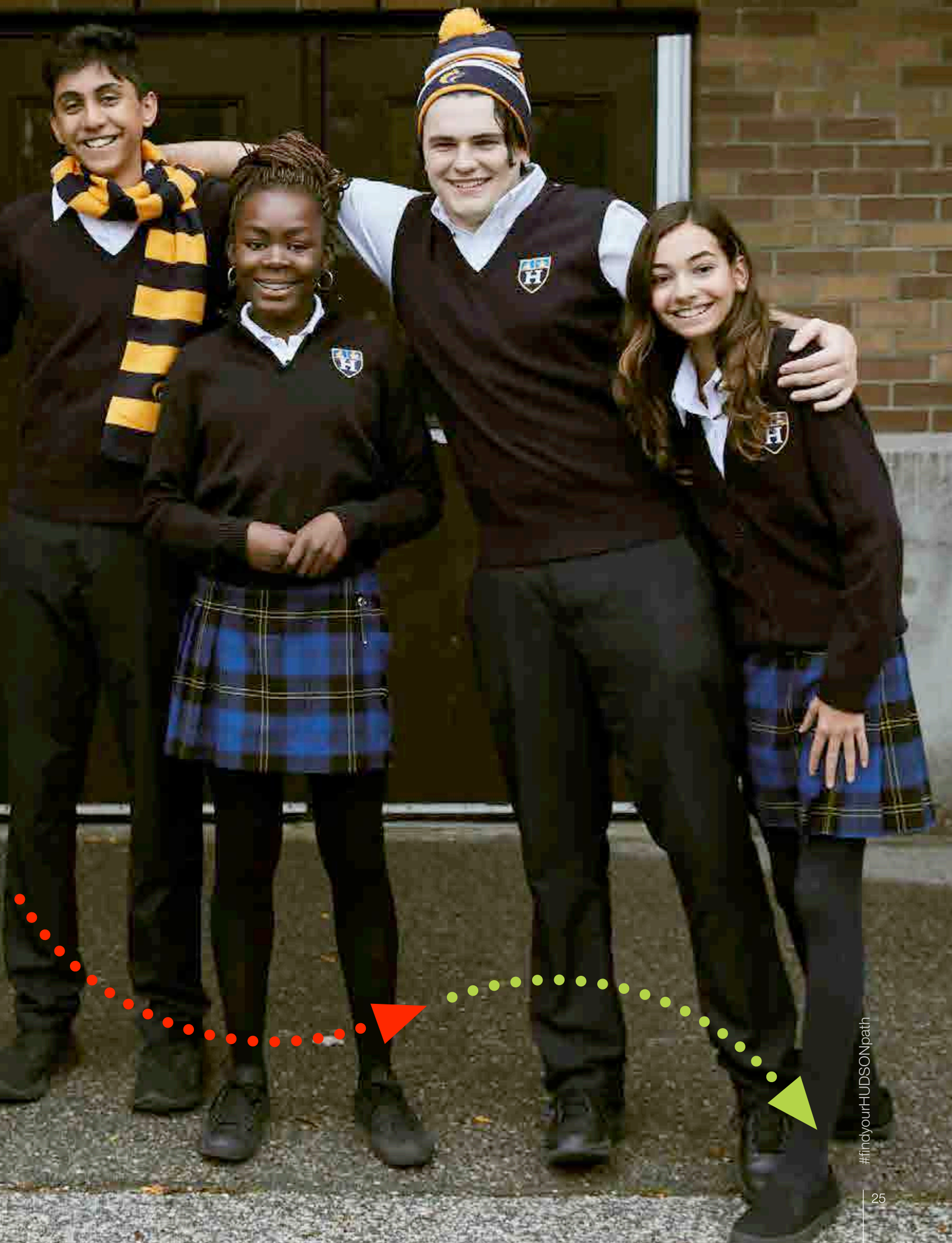
LEARN HOW YOU LEARN
