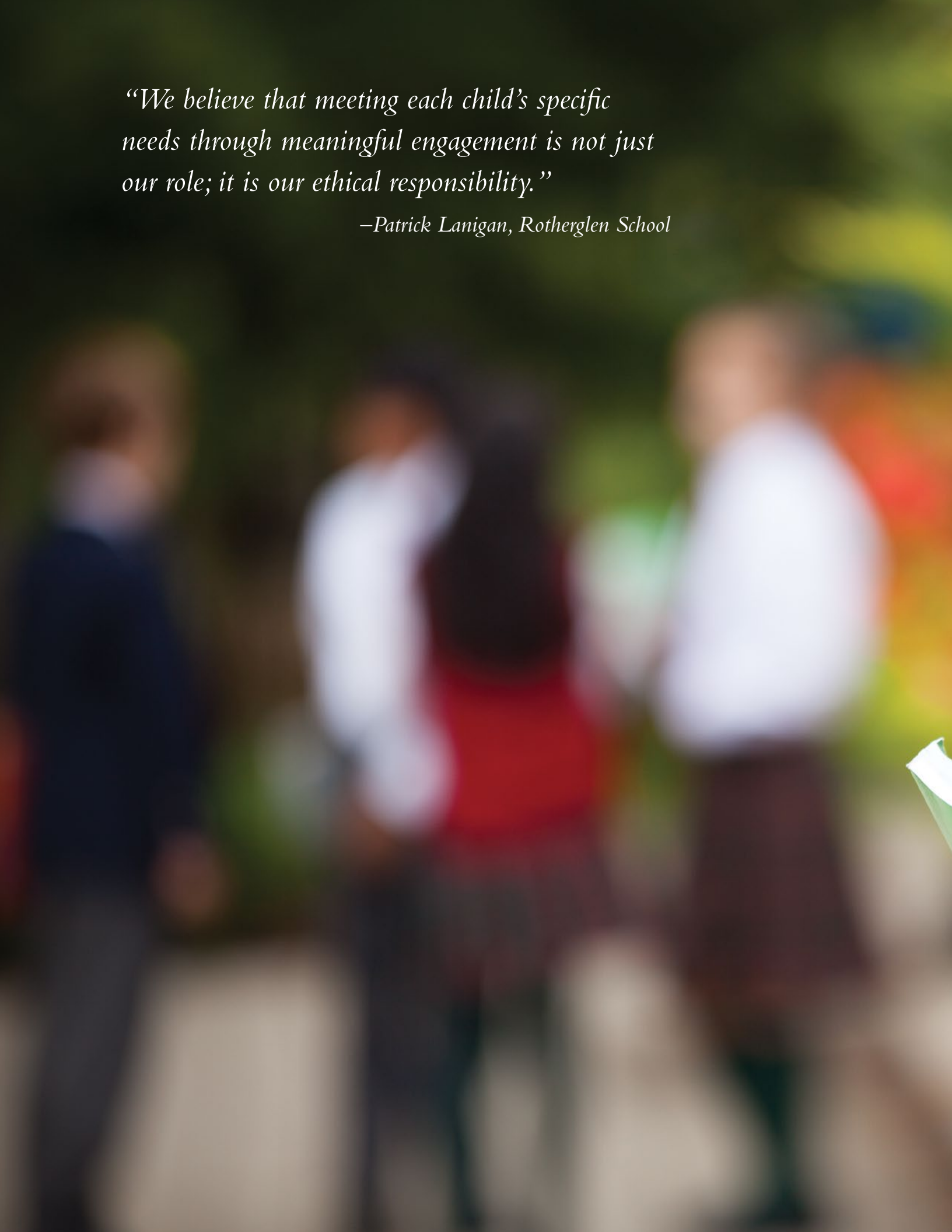

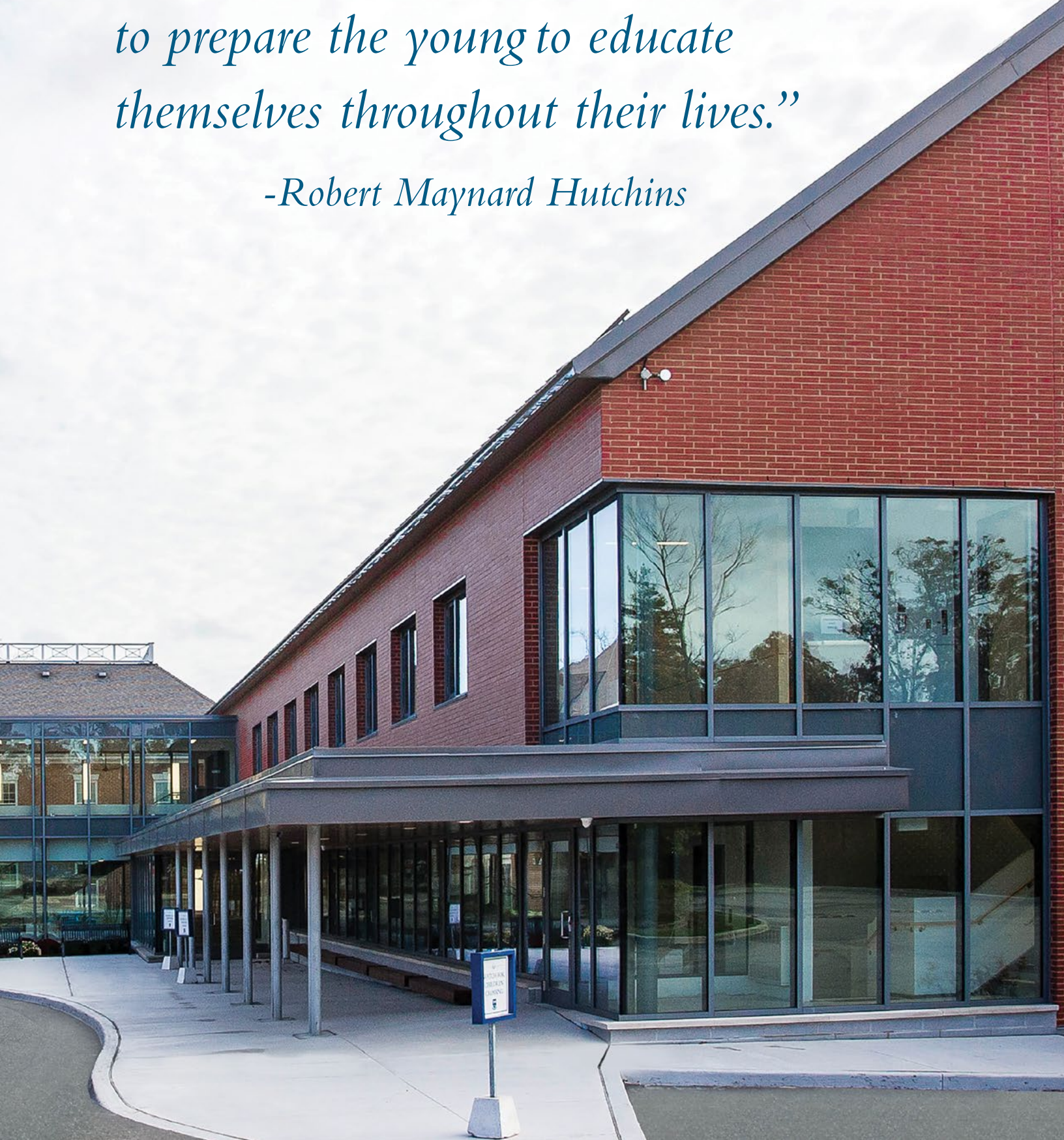

# Welcome

## to Rotherglen School Oakville Elementary Campus

Situated on a naturally wooded six-acre property, Rotherglen School provides a peaceful setting in the heart of North Oakville. Backing on to the picturesque Sixteen Mile Creek and Oakville's Heritage Trail System, our Elementary Campus provides Montessori instruction in Casa (ages 4 & 5) to Grade 3, and transitions to an enriched and progressive curriculum in Grades 4-8 that prepares students for their post-elementary education. Through the integration of academics, arts and athletics, as well as our exemplary character education and leadership program, we are able to meet each child at their place of learning.

True to our vision of **Engaged Minds, Inspired Hearts and Purposeful Lives**, we are committed to preparing our students to be meaningful contributors to their global community.

### Our Campus Facilities and Unique Offerings

Rotherglen School provides a warm and inviting atmosphere offering students in Casa to Grade 8 state-of-the-art facilities and programs including:

- Full-size gymnasium
- Junior gymnasium with heated floors
- Acoustically sound music room
- Art room with an outdoor courtyard
- Computer lab
- STEM lab
- Maximum class size – 18 students
- Library
- Demonstration kitchen classroom for cooking classes and home economics
- Outdoor classroom spaces in our wooded forest area
- Learning Success Centre containing a Learning Commons, open student work space, and private 1:1 Academic Resource Support rooms
- Extracurricular clubs including a variety of athletics, sports teams, chess, robotics, an annual school musical, choirs, and instrumental bands
- French, music, physical education, art, computers taught by specialist teachers
- Grade 9 credit subjects
- Before and after school care (7:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.)
- Leading-edge learning technology including SmartBoards, MacBooks, iPads, and Chromebooks
- Main playground with a soccer field, basketball courts, and play structures
- Junior playground with an artificial turf soccer field and “natural design” play structures

## Our academic program

Rotherglen provides a rigorous academic curriculum for our students at each grade level. We set our benchmarks high, and we motivate our students to perform to their best abilities. We find that our students rise to these challenges and are determined, engaged and happy learners. Our students perform above national norms on standardized achievement tests.

Within the framework of the curriculum we deliver, we teach our students to be problem solvers, critical thinkers, strong communicators and collaborators. Our program combines academics, arts, athletics, extracurricular activities, leadership opportunities and character education to address all aspects of our students’ growth and development.

Differentiated teaching and learning experiences designed to capitalize on each students’ unique learning style are supported by our well qualified (Montessori and/or OCT, and M.Ed.) teachers. High expectations for academic achievement co-exist with opportunities to experience the arts, athletics and community service within a caring and supportive environment.

## Casa Program (Ages 4 & 5)

Rotherglen's Montessori classrooms are carefully designed, and are comprised of five main areas that focus on experiential, hands on learning. These areas include: Practical Life, Mathematics, Language, Sensorial and Cultural Studies. Music and French instruction are also incorporated into the program early on and are taught by specialist teachers.

The focus in the Casa Classroom is to foster independence and instill confidence in our students to explore their own learning potential. This is achieved by preparing the classroom environment with attractive, purposeful materials for the children to manipulate and explore. Students are taught grace and courtesy at a young age, which gives each child a heightened sense of respect for others and for themselves. Students who experience our Montessori program exhibit superior academic skills in literacy and mathematics and have a solid foundation for future academic success.



Our Montessori qualified teachers guide our students toward working independently and learning through experience. In this way, students are active participants in their own learning and their intrinsic motivation and eagerness to learn is cultivated. The teacher-to-student ratio in the Casa program is 1:14.

This Rotherglen campus is primarily an elementary school. Therefore, positions in our Casa program are reserved for students who have siblings enrolled in Grades 1 – 8. However, students who wish to enroll in our Casa program can request information on our Primary Campus, conveniently located two blocks away on Sixth Line.



# Primary School (Grades 1 – 3)

Rotherglen's Lower Elementary program is firmly rooted in Montessori principles, while incorporating an enhanced Ontario curriculum, including French and music. Areas of study include: mathematics, English, French, history, geography, art, science, computers, music and physical education. We respond to each child's sensitive learning periods during these early school years. The Montessori philosophy involves a hands-on approach to learning. Attractive materials and resources, designed for a specific purpose, allow the student to develop a solid understanding of abstract concepts.

Our qualified and dedicated Montessori teachers guide students towards working independently and learning through experience. In this way, students are active participants in their own learning. Differentiated instruction and individual learning occurs in all of our classrooms. Our Grade 1 to 3 programming is supported by a variety of approaches derived from the larger educational community, ensuring a well-balanced and strong curriculum delivery. The teacher-to-student ratio in the Lower School is 1:18. Our Grade 1 to 3 students outperform their peers across Canada on nationally recognized achievement tests.

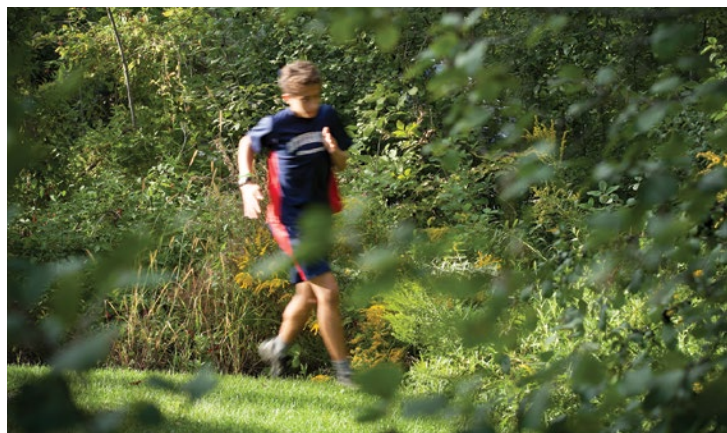


# Junior School (Grades 4 – 6)

Building upon a strong Montessori foundation, students are transitioned to an enriched and progressive academic program when they enter Grade 4.

In addition to our core academic programming, students receive instruction by specialist teachers in music, computers, physical education, art and French. The focus remains on providing a rich and stimulating program in which students are eager to learn. Activities designed to improve self-confidence, promote self-discipline, develop organizational skills, and encourage respect for self, others and our school community are incorporated into the program. The teacher-to-student ratio in the Junior School is 1:18.





# Upper School (Grades 7 & 8)

Rotherglen students in Grades 7 and 8 are taught 11 different subjects by a team of specialty teachers. Included in those 11 subjects are the six core subjects of English, mathematics, French, science, history and geography. Rotherglen also offers Grade 9 mathematics and ECT business courses. Complementing these to create a balanced curriculum are physical education and health, art, music, computers and our character education and leadership program. The goal in our Upper School program is to successfully prepare each individual student with the skills they require for success in secondary school and beyond.

To achieve this goal, we focus on the following principles:

- Instilling motivation and sense of personal responsibility
- Providing an enriched academic program within a nurturing and stimulating environment
- Focusing on the development of character and leadership

All Grade 7 & 8 students write final examinations at the end of the school year. Exams are 90 minutes in length and covers the year's curriculum in a given area of study. Our Grade 7 students write exams in English and mathematics, and our Grade 8 students write exams in mathematics, English, and Grade 9 ECT business.

# Character education

Character education is an intentional effort to cultivate positive personal attributes, leadership skills, and civility among our students. It is a whole-school effort to create a community in which positive attitudes, values and behaviours are fostered. At Rotherglen, these qualities are promoted, explicitly modeled, taught, expected, celebrated, and continuously practiced in every day actions. In short, character education is the promotion of universally desirable qualities such as respect, responsibility, honesty, empathy and integrity. Rotherglen has incorporated a strong Character Education program across all campuses and grade levels. All students examine a particular character trait each month and take part in activities, both in and out of the classroom, which focus on the development of specific character traits. Activities are also shared with our parent community to promote involvement of a strong, cohesive school community.

Rotherglen emphasizes high standards and academic excellence. Equally important is the knowledge and understanding of how to build and sustain effective personal relationships, and how to participate responsibly and effectively in society.

By incorporating character education into our curriculum in an intentional and systematic manner, our goal is to foster the democratic ideals of global citizenship, responsibility, justice and thoughtful decision-making. The implementation of our comprehensive Character Education and Leadership programs, along with our ongoing focus on development, ultimately support the growth, resiliency, success and wellness for our student body.



# REACH

## Giving back to our community

The **Rotherglen Educating in Advocacy, Character, and Hope (REACH)** Foundation is a non-profit corporation established to enrich the student experience and provide them with a vehicle to give back to their community. The Foundation provides a means for our students, parents and teachers to shape and give direction to our charitable initiatives beginning within our community and reaching further abroad. At the heart of its conception is the desire to foster awareness within our student body of their role as citizens of the world.

The **REACH** foundation has been established as an endowment fund with the Community Foundation of Oakville. Rotherglen's foundation serves as a way to meet our neighbours, build the community and have some fun. Each year, our Grade 8 students work collaboratively to decide how funds raised throughout the year for the **REACH** Foundation will be dispersed. The students are guided to research needs and collectively determine the cause that they are passionate to support.



# Cultivating **interests** beyond the classroom

## Extracurricular Activities

As part of our commitment to helping our students develop their own unique talents, we offer a variety of inclusive and non-competitive extracurricular activities that encompass many different interests. Students participate in a variety of extracurricular and after school clubs such as photography, chess, robotics, and drama, to name a few. These programs give students a chance to pursue emerging and common interests with classmates that can help to promote new friendships and deepen existing relationships. Activities are organized during lunch times, after school and as special events.



## Athletics

Through membership in the Private School Athletic Association (PSAA), our students are afforded the opportunity to compete against a number of independent schools throughout the year in soccer, cross-country, volleyball, basketball, floor hockey, and track and field. Tournaments are organized by the Junior Division (Grades 5 and 6) and the Intermediate Division (Grades 7 and 8). We encourage all interested students to participate in tryouts for school teams. We also offer additional competitive opportunities for students including intramural and intraschool tournaments.

## Performing Arts

The rewards of education in the arts is readily apparent in the confidence they display and the joy in their expressions from acting on stage. Although drama is part of our curriculum, each year, more than 100 students from Grades 5 to 8 also join the cast of our annual musical. The productions are staged at the Oakville Centre for Performing Arts and over one thousand tickets are sold each year. Past productions include: *The Wizard of Oz*, *Oliver*, *The Sound of Music*, *Alice in Wonderland*, *Cinderella*, *Peter Pan* and *Mulan*.



# A culture of mutual respect

At Rotherglen, a premium is placed on the concept of respect, and on the safety and well-being of our students. We encourage our students to explore their interests, and we support them as they experience multiple activities. We actively promote the development of moral character at every grade level. Each student is encouraged to strive for academic excellence, personal development, respect and global citizenship. Students are better able to achieve these outcomes when they are connected to a safe, secure and inclusive community.

All students, parents, teachers and staff members have the right to be safe, and feel safe, in the school community. With this right comes the responsibility to contribute to a positive school climate. The promotion of strategies and initiatives, such as character education and leadership development, along with progressive prevention and intervention strategies to address inappropriate behaviour, fosters a positive school climate that supports academic achievement for all students.

Responsible citizenship involves appropriate participation in the civic life of the school community. Active and engaged citizens are aware of their rights, but more importantly, they accept responsibility for protecting their rights and the rights of others.

# Safe and inclusive learning community

## Code of Conduct

Standards of behaviour apply not only to students, but also to all individuals involved in the Rotherglan community – parents/guardians, volunteers, teachers, and staff members – whether they are on school property, on school buses, at school-related events or activities, or in other circumstances that could have an impact on the school climate.

The purpose of our Code of Conduct is to provide a learning environment that is: safe, inclusive and accepting of all students; to encourage a positive school climate and prevent inappropriate behaviour. Bullying or harassment in any form will not be tolerated by the school and we are committed to addressing inappropriate student behaviour and promote early intervention and support.

Creating a safe and inclusive school environment involves the support from all members of our community. As a school we are committed to preventing and intervening in situations of bullying. School Administration, faculty members, parents and students all play a role in creating a safe learning environment. In addressing bullying prevention and intervention, Rotherglan School administrators take a leadership role in the school by:

- Actively addressing bullying situations;
- Demonstrating care for the school community and a commitment to academic excellence in a safe and nurturing teaching and learning environment;
- Holding all members of the Rotherglan community accountable for their behaviour and actions;
- Empowering students to be positive leaders in their school and community;
- Communicating regularly and meaningfully with all members of their school community;
- Ensuring the communication of bullying prevention and intervention policies;
- Providing an example of respect and civility for all members of the school community.

## Allergy Aware

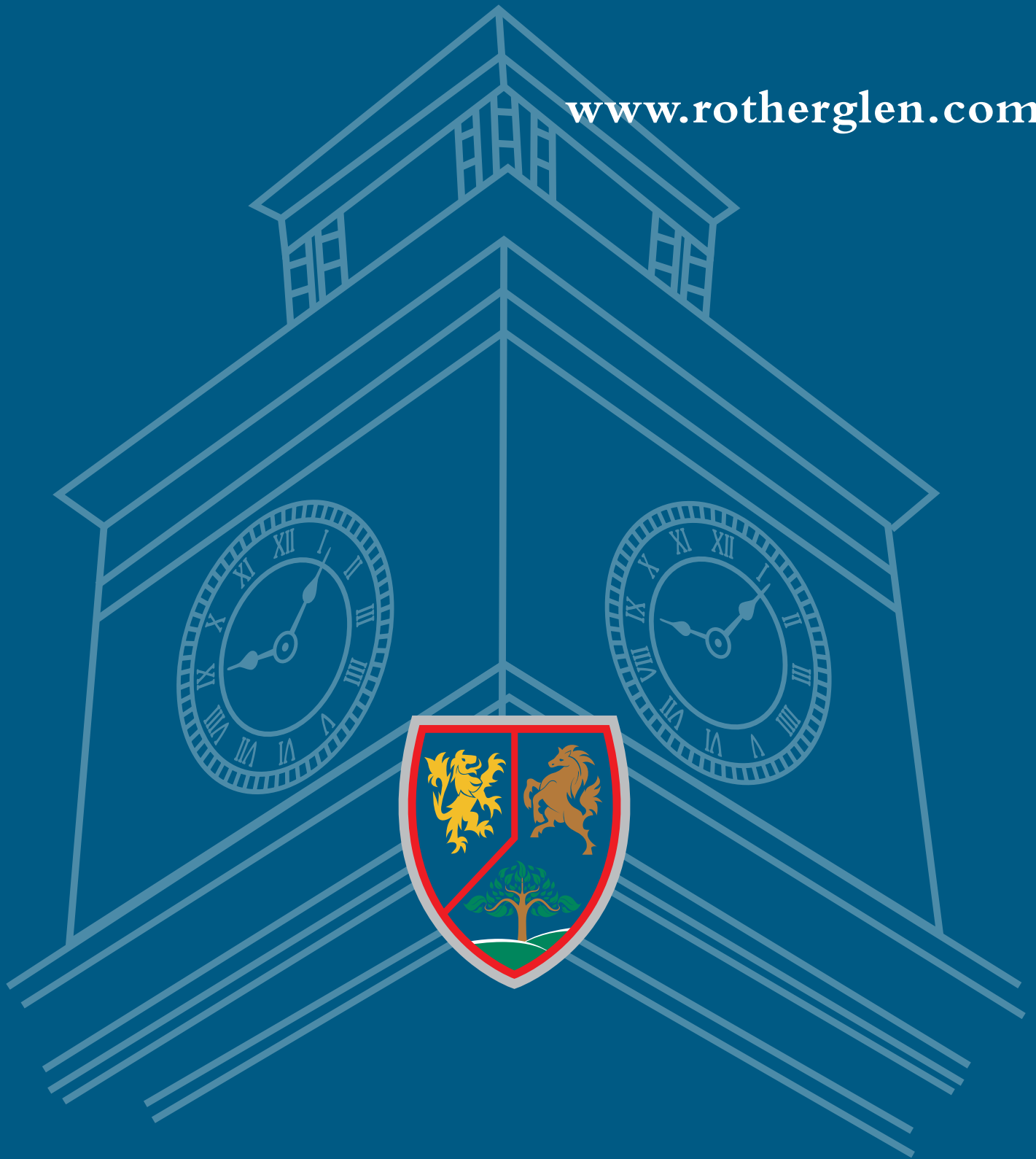
Rotherglan School recognizes that there are a number of students attending the school who have potentially life-threatening allergies, known medically as anaphylaxis. In accordance with Bill 3, Sabrina's Law, preventative measures are required on the part of both the parent/guardian and the school, together with the support of the school community. This includes information and awareness for the entire Rotherglan community; strategies to reduce the risk of exposure to the allergen; and a communication and emergency response procedure in case of accidental exposure.

Given the severity of these student allergies, foods containing nuts and/or shellfish are not permitted at Rotherglan School. Although we are an Allergy Aware school, we do not and cannot guarantee a shellfish or nut-free environment. Parents of students with anaphylaxis must also take responsibility for their child's safety.

## Supervision
