At This Point in Our History

Happy Birthday to us! This year marks the 150th anniversary of the founding of Stanstead College in 1872. It took a full year to build the school, and actual classes didn't begin until January, 1874. The school has run uninterrupted since. Not even a devastating fire in 1938 could curtail the school year. Everyone simply found alternative spaces to carry on, not quite as usual but as best as they could.

Not all changes are as dramatic or as destructive as fires, thankfully. For example, Stanstead College once operated a business college and a music conservatory, both of which earned esteemed reputations before closing in the late 1950s. From 1958 to 1979, Stanstead College was an all-boys school. As the 80s rolled around, the girls returned. The school operated a cadet corps for over 100 years. There was even a small ski-lift down the bank to the Tomifobia River in the back of the school.

In 1977, the school chose to no longer accept provincial funding so it could set its own policies, including allowing Quebec francophone students to enroll without certificates of eligibility.

Stanstead College continues to evolve. Over the past 20 years, the school has seen the development of an elite hockey program, the construction of the Pat Burns Arena, a new Grade 12 residence and—currently under construction—a new junior girls residence and a wellness centre. We have seen record enrolment over the past few years.

It has been a privilege and an honour to oversee a number of these changes as head of school for the past 17 years. This year will be my last, as I prepare to retire and we transition to our next head of school, Joanne Carruthers, our first female head—and long overdue! Stanstead College will continue to be in excellent hands.

As our history shows, Mrs. Carruthers and I are just two in a long line of people who have worked to make Stanstead College one of the top small independent schools in North America. For 150 years, teachers, administrators and staff have consistently understood that what draws young women and men to our school is their dedication to providing the very best quality education and opportunities for personal growth and development.

I hope you will enjoy this edition of SC Magazine and learning more about what makes Stanstead College special!

Grade 12 Class of 2021

In 2022, 100% of our Grade 12 graduates received acceptances to 4-year colleges. There were 66 students in Grade 12. Our graduates received offers from many post-secondary institutions, including 34 Canadian, 41 American and 15 international schools across 6 provinces, 16 states and 6 countries. A third of the class chose majors in science, engineering or health while just under one third chose social sciences or business.

Work is now under way on two new facilities to meet the growing needs of our Stanstead College community. This past spring, the school's existing health centre was demolished to make way for a new Wellness Centre, which will have modern examination rooms and offices for the nurses and school counselor, as well as living accommodations for two staff members plus an overnight nurse. There will also be separate overnight facilities for boys and girls.

While the centre is under construction, the health team has temporarily relocated to Alumni House, the former Advancement and Communications offices.

Next to the Wellness Centre will see the construction of a new residence for junior girls. The addition of a new girls prep hockey team last year has added to the demand for spaces for young girls. The residence will also relieve pressure in Webster House, which is currently housing girls in Grades 7 to 11. A new home for the junior girls will create a more balanced campus, allowing juniors and seniors to have their own space to bond.

Hockey Training Centre

During the fall 2021, The Jankowski Family Training Centre was opened to the Stanstead College community. Located in the former bus garage between the Amaron and Mackay Gyms, the centre has allowed hockey players to train in the off season and in their free time. The 60-by-30-foot centre includes synthetic ice, regulated boards and plexiglass, radar gun and readout sign, stick-handling machine, two shooting tarps, resistance machine and a skate-changing area.

The centre was completely funded by donations from alumni, including a significant contribution by the Jankowski family (Mark 2012, David 2015). Mark Jankowski earned an NCAA men's hockey championship with Providence College and spent four seasons with the Calgary Flames and later with the Pittsburgh Penguins and Buffalo Sabres. David played for four years with the St. Lawrence Saints (NCAA D1).



Construction on Stanstead Wesleyan College started in 1872, and in August 1873 the hope remained that the facility could open by the middle of November.



However, cold and harsh winters had slowed down the process and it was now the middle of the school year. Stanstead Wesleyan College finally opened on January 7, 1874 to complete the school year.

The new building was massive for its time. Constructed of granite and brick, it was advertised that it could house all teachers as well as 200 boarders and 100 day students plus servants! Rooms were furnished at a cost of \$3 per week, and each one consisted of a closet, chairs, bedsteads, bedding, a wash-stand, a stove, a bureau, a mirror and a table.

When the idea of building a school in Stanstead had first been discussed, the option of making it a ladies

college had been thoroughly examined, but the proponents of a co-educational establishment had prevailed – making it the first of its kind in Canada. Both sexes would attend the same classes, but they occupied different sections in the classrooms and were not allowed to talk to one another. They had separate entrances to the building as well as separate grounds. The only time they could mingle was during meals and in the parlour when chaperoned by members of the faculty.

In its first year, out of the 139 students, 71 were ladies and 68 were gentlemen. Approximately 20 students were boarders. Stanstead Wesleyan College's first graduate would also be a young woman, Clara J. Stevens, who would graduate with a MEL (English) Ladies Collegiate diploma.

Different degrees were available based on the student's gender. Ladies could choose a three-year course in English, a four-year course in Modern Languages or a four-year course in Classics. Gentlemen had their pick among a common English course, an Academic course, a teacher's preparatory course (normal school), college preparatory, the Industrial and Scientific Department or the Commercial Department (which offered penmanship, bookkeeping, banking and commercial law). Also available were classes in fine arts (music, drawing, painting, etc.).

When all gathered on June 30 for the first closing exercises, most felt satisfied in their choice of Stanstead for the location of this new school. In 1873-1874, Stanstead was a wealthy town that could hold its own against the large cities of the province without many of their pitfalls.

"It's like everyone there is rooting for you.

Academics at Stanstead College

Students at Stanstead College engage in experiential learning, critical thinking, problem solving and teamwork.

Small class sizes from Grades 7 to 12 ensure that students receive the attention they need. Based on Quebec Ministry of Education guidelines, with core subjects of Mathematics, English and French at all levels, our rigorous academic program encourages a high level of achievement that contributes to an excellent acceptance rate at first-choice universities.

With an advisor system to keep track of individual progress and educational resources such as evening study and a learning centre, students are well prepared to reach their goals.

Students receive their high school leaving certificate from Quebec upon completion of Grade 11, then complete their studies in Grade 12. This intensive preparatory year provides students with a rigorous academic program leading to a Grade 12 diploma recognized across Canada, the United States and around the world. ESL and English support

Stanstead offers ESL support as well as a structured ESL program for Grade 7 to 9 with an aim of integrating students into the regular academic stream as quickly as possible. All students sign a contract agreeing that they will speak English during the academic day.

The goal is to prepare our non-English speakers for the language demands of university in North America. With that in mind, the school arranges TOEFL and IELTS testing for students in senior grades.

What about Grade 12?

Stanstead College is one of only a small number of schools in Quebec that offer a Grade 12 year. Ours is based on Ontario Grade 12 pre-university courses as well as a wide selection of Advanced Placement courses.

- Comprehensive career education and university guidance
- Committed faculty and staff
- Exclusive co-ed Grade 12 residence

Why AP?

Advanced Placement offers the student academic enrichment, the development of study and test-taking skills, and, in many cases, **first-year credits at college and university**. AP allows students to choose enrichment in their stronger subjects and the development of study and test-taking skills. In addition, the external testing offered by the AP program is valuable in the university admission process because, unlike school marks, exam scores are comparable regardless of where the exam was administered. The **AP** curriculum truly completes our school program and complements the Stanstead mission. Stanstead College also offers the possibility of independent online courses.

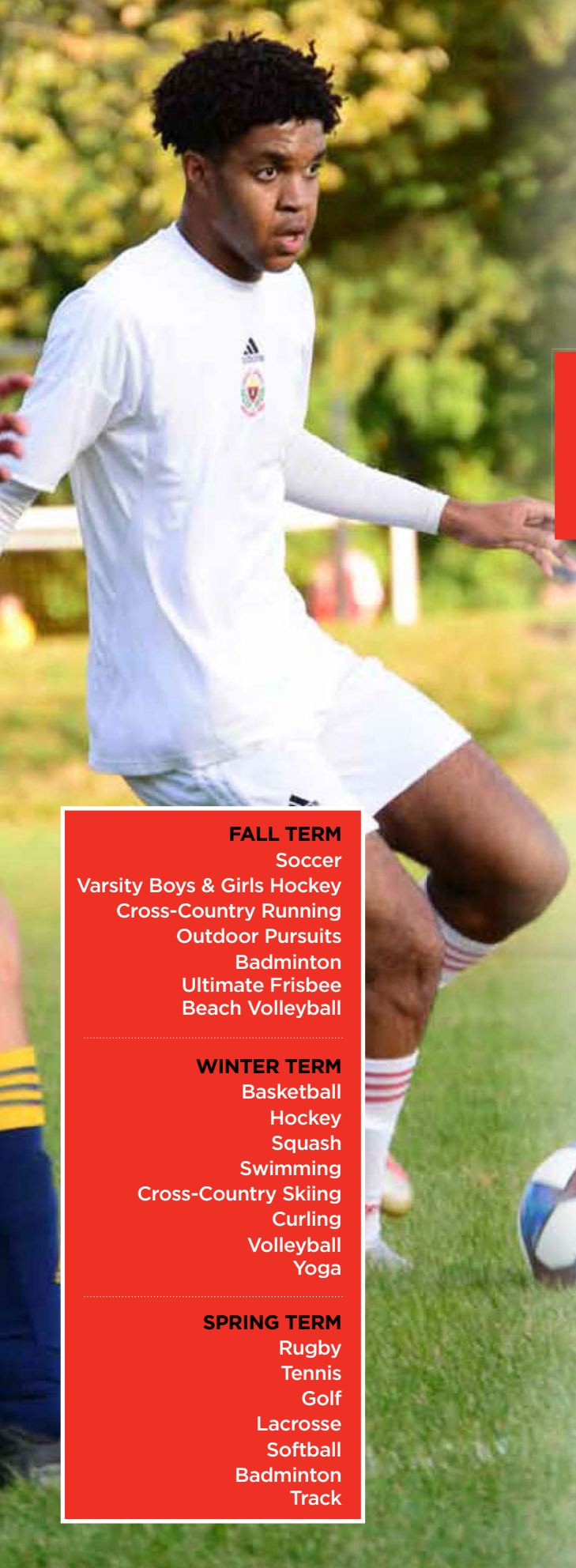

Jamal was an MVP basketball player over two years at Stanstead College and went on to compete at McGill University, helping the team earn the RSEQ provincial championships in 2018 and 2022. In the 2020 and 2021 seasons, Jamal was named team MVP and was an RSEQ First Team All-Star. In 2019 and 2020, he was ranked No. 1 in Canada for 3-point shooting (52% and 48%). As team captain, he led the Quebec league in scoring in 2022 with an average of 18.3 points per game, earned second team All-Canadian honours and was named McGill's player of the year.

Residential Life

Stanstead College has four residences – Bugbee House for junior boys, Colby House for junior girls, Davis House for senior boys and Webster House for senior girls. Each offers a safe, nurturing environment for students from around the world to live and work together. Each residence is overseen by live-in house directors and their families, teachers-on-duty and student prefects who make sure the environment is one of respect and cooperation.

Faculty Advisors

Each Stanstead student is assigned to an advisor who follows the student's academic progress, troubleshoots when necessary and generally helps ensure that the student is getting the most out of his or her experience at the school. The advisor also acts as the liaison between the school and the student's parents. It's a relationship that ensures no student falls between the cracks.



Meals

Stanstead College has a fully equipped dining hall offering a variety of healthy meals, including vegetarian options. Family-style lunches with assigned seating are another way for students to meet and interact with their peers in a pleasant, courteous setting.

Eric T. Webster Student Centre

The student centre is a popular meeting place for students during free time. Equipped with a tuck shop, giant-screen TV, projector, music system, pool table, ping pong and foosball, the centre is a place to relax and meet up with friends.



Health Services

Stanstead College has 24-hour nursing coverage and clinics throughout the day. A full-time professional counsellor is also based in the Health Centre to respond to the emotional needs of the students. In addition, a doctor comes to the school once a week to attend to the students' health needs. Stanstead College also has access to a dedicated physiotherapist and a life coach.

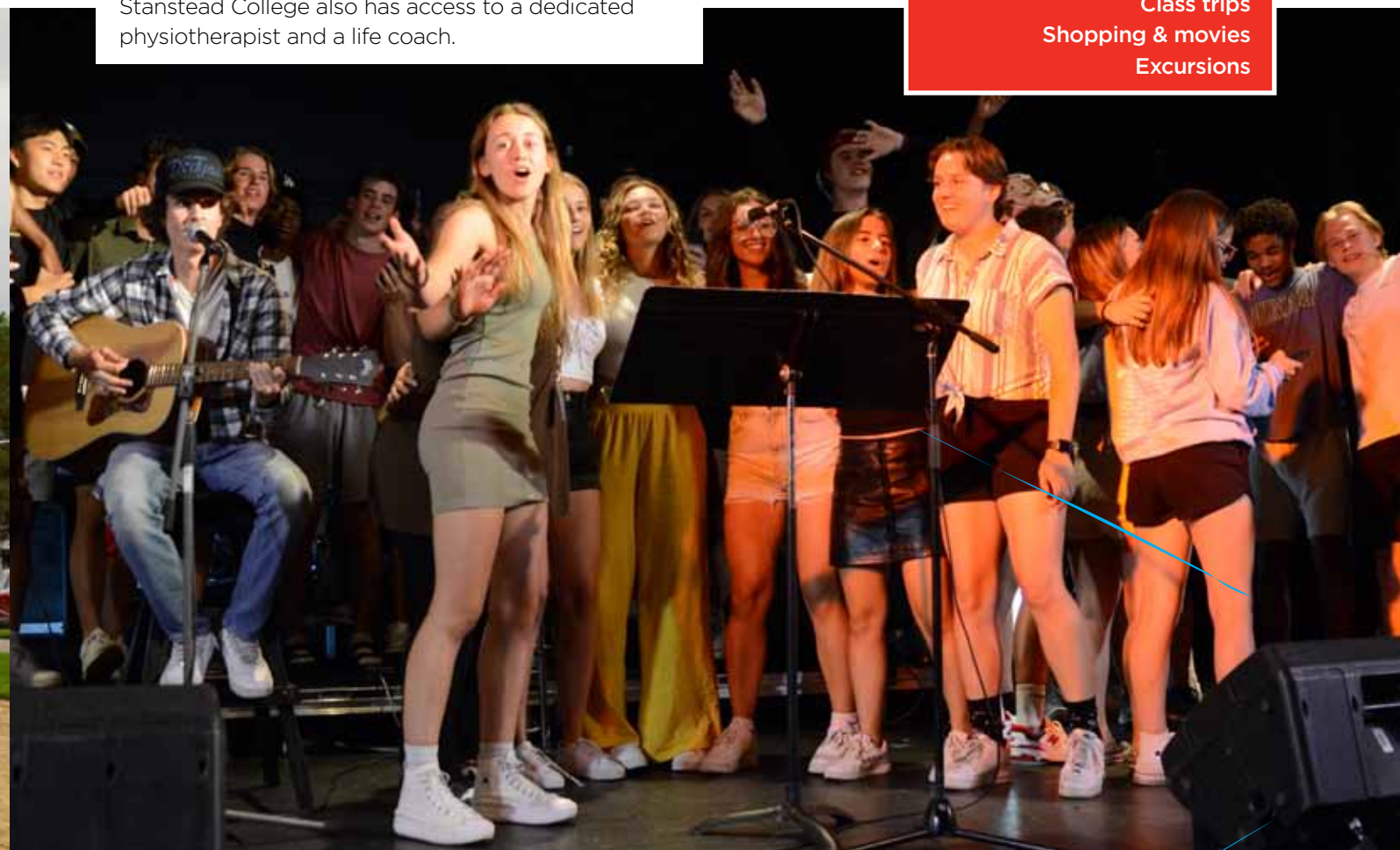

The Arts Are All Around

It's late in the afternoon, and the sound of electric guitar drifts across the campus. A student is taking advantage of warm spring weather to work out the kinks of a new song. In a few days, he'll be on stage with his friends playing the number for the entire school at the end-of-year Variety Show.

This much-anticipated event is just one of many opportunities students have to express themselves creatively at Stanstead College.

The arts are built right into the academic program. Music at all levels of experience is offered in Grades 7 through 11 (mandatory in Grades 7-9. The class allows students to start on a new instrument of their choosing or develop their skills on those they already play. In addition to theory, students gain practical playing experience in group and solo settings.



Finally, Drama is offered as an option in Grade 10, with students learning the history and fundamentals of drama, from Greek tragedy and improv to writing and performing their own scripts.

Outside the curriculum, club options allow students to jam with other musicians, practice creative writing or create art for pleasure. The Drama Club produces a major production each spring, performed before the full school as well as the public.

As with the Variety Show, the annual Café Cappuccino brings the school together each spring to cheer on their peers as they perform live. And as with many activities at Stanstead, students are often joined by teachers on stage.

"The memories and connections we make with these kids, young people discovering music, taking chances with adult leadership - we are so lucky," says Café Capp organizer and physics teacher Erik Van Dyke.

Like the chords of an electric guitar, the arts are all around at Stanstead College.



The Christian Williams Art Centre is home to our Art Department, offering classes in all levels - mandatory for Grade 7-9 and optional for Grade 10-12, including Advanced Placement Visual Arts in Grade 12. The Art Centre includes dedicated spaces for creating visual arts, including a full pottery studio. A walk through the hallways of our school reveals the fruits of student creativity on the walls.

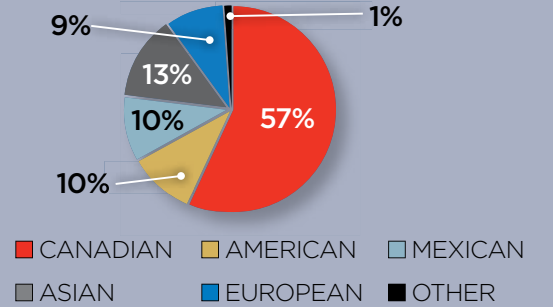

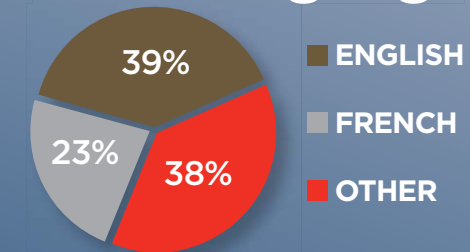

How to apply

Step 1

Contact a member of the Admissions team. If possible, visit the school during a Campus Visit Day or by appointment.

Step 2

Complete our online application form; you can find the link anywhere on our website. Your application should include:

- three references (two from your current school and one personal);
- a short essay about your goals and how Stanstead College can help you achieve them;
- school transcripts (report cards) from the last two years;
- photos;
- and a copy of your birth certificate.

Step 3

Write our admissions test, the SSAT or an English language test (TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo or TOEFL Junior).

Step 4

Have an interview in person or online with a member of our Admissions team. Tell us why Stanstead College will be a better place by accepting you.

Acceptance:

Applications are received and accepted on an ongoing basis throughout the year. However, it is important to note that places are limited. Priority will be given to applications submitted before the end of March.
